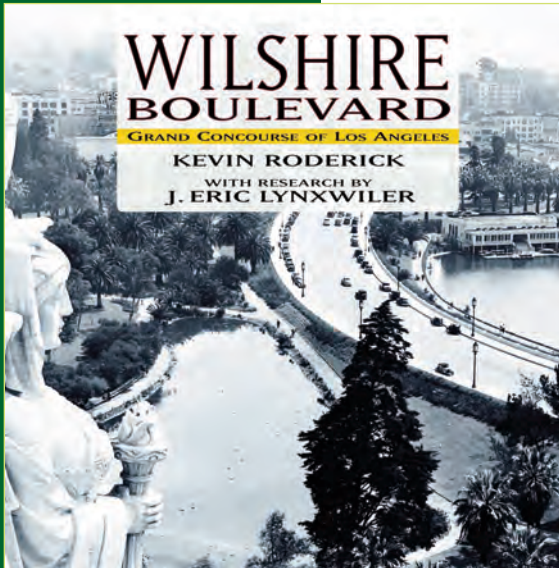

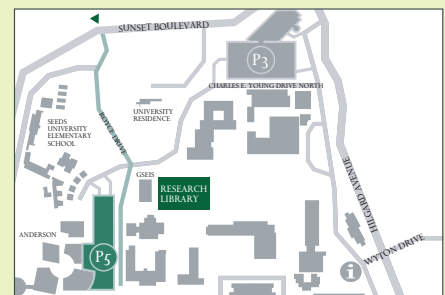
Author Kevin Roderick and researcher Eric Lynxwiler will discuss the glamour and importance of Wilshire Boulevard, Los Angeles' unofficial main street, and show images from their book, *Wilshire Boulevard: Grand Concourse of Los Angeles*.

Roderick, a native Angeleno, is the editor and publisher of *LA Observed* and a weekly commentator on the National Public Radio station KCRW. He is also director of the UCLA Newsroom and a contributing writer for *Los Angeles Magazine* and was previously a senior editor and staff writer at the *Los Angeles Times*. Lynxwiler, a graduate of UCLA, is an urban anthropologist who conducts tours for the Los Angeles Conservancy and has received national attention for his "neon cruises" of nighttime L.A. offered through the Museum of Neon Art.
