Collections Conservator Kristen St. John, suggesting the best ways to safeguard your precious artifacts

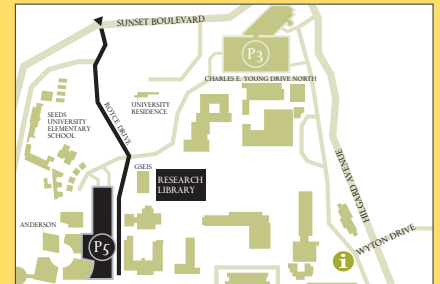
UCLA Archivist Charlotte Brown, exploring what constitutes a family archive
