


Find Useful General, Business, Historical & Other Articles Using EBSCO Databases

<p>What's in it?</p> <p>21 Databases, Including...</p>	<p>Academic Search Complete: Articles from 5,500 periodicals on a variety of topics (Some as early as 1865 - present)</p> <p>Business Source Premier: Articles from 7,400 business journals covering management, economics, finance, international business, and more (Some as early as 1926 - present)</p> <p>America: History & Life: Magazine & journal articles on U.S. and Canadian history (1964-present)</p> <p>Historical Abstracts: Magazine & journal articles on world history (except U.S. & Canada) from 1450 onward (1967 - present)</p>
<p>Why use it?</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To find useful periodical articles on a variety of topics To find additional search words for information research
<p>Get Started</p>	<p>Start at the UCLA Library Homepage: http://www2.library.ucla.edu/</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Pull down the Search and Find menu, click on Article Databases. Type Academic Search Complete in the box and click on the link under that title.
<p>Search</p>	<p>Type search words & click on Search—example:</p> <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 5px;">  </div>
<p>Find More</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use fewer search words in the boxes above your results & click Search. <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 10px; text-align: center;"> <p>Still too few?</p> <p>Put one word in each search box. <u>Or</u>, click "Choose Databases" at the top, to the right of the database name, and add or change databases.</p> </div>
<p>Find Less</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Add more search words. <div style="border: 1px solid black; padding: 10px; text-align: center;"> <p>Still too many?</p> <p>Click on a Source Type in the left column or move the date slider to the right in the right column or remove databases.</p> </div>

Use a "Truncation" symbol for singular, plural, variant spellings or the root of a word.<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Any number of characters: * EXAMPLE: child*2. Use a "Wildcard" symbol to represent a single character within a word.<ul style="list-style-type: none">• One character: ? EXAMPLE: wom?n3. Click "Search History/Alerts to review or revise your searches during a session, or to set up an Alert, so that you will be notified of new items on your topic when they are added to the database.4. Scroll down and use one or more different search modes or limits to focus your search.
