This list includes Chinese remote online databases subscribed, purchased or exchanged by the East Asian Library. Free Internet databases are listed under "Selected Internet Resources on East Asian" on the EAL home page, divided by geographic areas.

Chinese Classics

- **CHANT (Chinese Ancient Texts) Database**

香港中文大學古文獻資料庫 (華夏文庫)

Hong Kong : Chinese University of Hong Kong.

Searchable full-text database focusing on pre-600 AD traditional and excavated Chinese texts. Can be accessed via UCLA campus networks or the Bruin-Online connection from home. Chinese input software required to search.

- **Encyclopedia of Taiwan**

As one of the largest and most important academic collections compiled in Taiwan, the Series includes 309 titles (595 volumes) of Chinese classics related to Taiwanese studies.

- **Gujin Tushu Jicheng**

古今圖書集成

Gujin Tushu Jicheng, compiled in the Kangxi years of the Qing Dynasty (1644-1911), is a major classic series title classified by subjects (*lei shu*). It covers a wide range of subject fields, including many rare classic titles that were not available in other places. The series certainly fills some gaps as research resources. With full-text searching capacity of the online

database, the classic series can be much easier to access to in comparing with the printed version.

Taipei, Taiwan: Academia Sinica

Chinese full-text database for hundreds of works in history (including history of Taiwan), classics, religion, medicine, literature, and law, etc. Major titles include Er shi wu shi 二十五史 (Twenty-five Dynastic Histories), Shi san jing 十三經 (Thirteen Classics), Taisho Tripitaka (大正新脩大藏經), Tai ping yu lan (太平御覽), Wen xian tong kao (文獻通考), etc. Full, free access available to UCLA faculty, staff, and students via UCLA campus networks or the Bruin-Online connection from home. Chinese input software required to search.

Note: For accessing to the Chinese classics of the database, please use URL <http://140.109.138.249/ihp/hanji.htm>, and choose "Authorized Use" (授權使用). You might need to use VPN, instead of Proxy server, for remote access.

- **[Si bu cong kan dian zi ban \(Electronic Sibü Congkan\)](#)**

*** Accessible on the public PC in the EAL reading room.

Provides full-text searching capability for the entire set of Sibü Congkan. Search results can be viewed in digitized texts or in images of the original pages. Also provides some useful online reference tools. Faculty members may request to have the search software installed on their office or home computers.

Hong Kong : Chinese University of Hong Kong.

Provides full-text searching capability for the entire set of Siku Quanshu. Search results can be viewed in digitized texts or in images of the original pages. Also provides some useful online reference tools, such as dictionary, calendar conversion tables, etc. Access is available through any computer connected to the UCLA network.

Chinese Periodicals

- **China Academic Journals**

Beijing : Tsinghua Tongfang Optical Disc Co.

Consists of the full text and full images of 1,710 Chinese language journals in the Literature/History/Philosophy, Economics/Politics/Law, and Education/Social Science sections of the database. Covers from 1994 to present and is updated daily. Available via UCLA campus network or the Bruin-Online dialup connection from home. On the Login screen, click on **[Search]** directly to access the full-text database. Download the CAJViewer (Windows only) when prompted. The publisher also provides free access to its **Bibliographic Database**, covering citations of periodical articles in all subjects for the same time period. On the Login screen, choose **CAJ Bibliographic** then click on **[Search]** to access. Chinese input software required to search both databases.

statistical data, essential to the studies of China's population, socio-economy and local society.

An online index to over 150 periodicals published in Hong Kong since 1990, with some titles as early as 1950s. It includes only the articles related to social, economic, political, and current events, as well as social sciences.

- **[People's Daily \(1946-2005\)](#)**

With a current circulation of 3 million, People's Daily is the most influential and authoritative newspaper in China. Created in May 1946, People's Daily carries the latest news dispatches of policy information and resolutions of the Chinese Government and major domestic news and international news releases from China. UCLA has acquired access to its complete full-text content of 1946-2005. A separate database covering 1995-present is freely available to the public.

It is searchable by date, author, title, column, page, section, and keyword. It also can be browsed by date. All articles can be displayed and printed in full text.

UDNDATA is a newspaper database of the United Daily News Group, the largest news group in Taiwan. UDNDA covers seven Chinese newspapers in Taiwan, Europe and North America: *Lian He Bao* (聯合報), *Jing Ji Ri Bao* (經濟日報), *Min Sheng Bao* (民生報), *Lian He Wan Bao* (聯合晚報), *Xing Bao* (星報) in Taiwan, *Ouzhou Ri Bao* (歐洲日報) in Europe and *Meizhou Shi Jie Ri Bao* (美洲世界日報) in North America. This online database provides current and searchable full-text articles, as well as searchable images, published on the above seven newspapers. It is not only a major information source on Taiwan, but also an important information source on overseas Chinese in Europe and North America.

As an affiliate of Chinese Ministry of Science & Technology, Wanfang Data has been the leading information provider in China since 1950s. With a wide range of database resources and value-added services, Wanfang Data has become a gateway to understand Chinese culture, medicine, business, science, etc. The

UCLA Library has subscribed to five databases of Wanfang Data: Policies and Laws of China; Chinese Companies and Products; Dissertations of China; China Academic Conference Proceedings; and China Online Journals. Available via UCLA campus network or the Bruin-Online dialup connection from home.

Apabi E-Books is one of the major e-book databases in China. A significant feature of the Apabi e-books is full-text search capacity. Currently about 4,800 e-nook titles are available to UCLA and UC Merced users, mainly in the field of Chinese literature.
